

International Out-of-State Tuition Waiver

Undergraduate and graduate students currently attending NMSU-Main Campus

The International Out-of-State Tuition Waiver Scholarship Program has available a limited number of scholarships each academic year reserved for currently enrolled NMSU main campus students who have demonstrated outstanding achievements in academics, leadership and/or service. Scholarship recipients receive a waiver of the out-of-state tuition fees and will be charged tuition at the in-state rate. To apply, complete and return the application to International Student & Scholar Services.

Because there are a limited number of scholarships available to current NMSU students, selection of the award recipients will be made twice each year according to the posted date below. Scholarships will be given to graduate and undergraduate students in various majors. A scholarship award cannot be deferred to a later semester. International Student and Scholar Services will notify all students after the selections have been made.

Eligibility

Undergraduate Students

- Must have cumulative GPA of 3.50 or higher
- The maximum number of semesters that a scholarship can be awarded is eight, or graduation, whichever comes first. An award given to a student currently enrolled at NMSU is determined by deducting the number of postsecondary semesters completed from the maximum of eight semesters.
- **Scholarship renewal:** An undergraduate student must successfully complete twelve graded credits and maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 3.50 each semester.

Graduate Students

- Must have cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher
- **Masters students:** The maximum number of semesters that a scholarship can be awarded is four, or graduation, whichever comes first. An award given to a student currently enrolled at NMSU is determined by deducting the number of postsecondary semesters completed from the maximum of four.
- **Doctoral students:** The maximum number of semesters that a scholarship can be awarded is eight, or graduation, whichever comes first. An award given to a student currently enrolled at NMSU is determined by deducting the number of postsecondary semesters completed from the maximum of eight.
- **Scholarship renewal:** A graduate student must successfully complete nine graduate credits and maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 3.75 each semester.

Scholarship Application Deadlines

Fall Semester -- June 1st

Spring Semester -- November 1st
